



# Junior Offroad

## 2019 JUNIOR OFFROAD STATE CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

### 1. THE CHAMPIONSHIP

Motorcycling Western Australia (MWA) shall approve a multi-round series to form the Junior State Offroad Championships of Western Australia (the Championship). The Championship will be open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Junior National Competition Licences or One Event Licences, and will be conducted under Motorcycling Australia permits as issued by MWA and run under the Enduro Rules as stated in the 2019 MA Manual of Motorcycle Sport (2019 MoMS), these State Championship Regulations, the event Supplementary Regulations and any other requirements approved by the Motorcycling Western Australia Enduro Panel (the Enduro Panel).

The Championship will be comprised of at least three separate Championship Rounds (Rounds). One Round will be run by Dirt High Promotions and two Rounds will be run by the Offroad Riding Club of WA. Championship Rounds will consist of a mixture of Non-stop Cross Country, Cross Country Sprint, Enduro Sprint, and other Rounds or formats may be approved by the Enduro Panel.

### 2. CHAMPIONSHIP SCHEDULE AND FORMATS

The Championship Rounds will be as listed in the table below.

The Clerk of Course reserves the right to alter the starting order at any Round for the purpose of safety.

### 3. ELIGIBLE CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES/GRADES

The Championship will be conducted in the following age, gender and engine capacity classes (Classes):

- **J4** 15 years 125-200cc 2 stroke and 200-250cc 4 stroke
- **J3** 13-14 years 125-200cc 2 stroke and 200-250cc 4 stroke
- **J2** 12-15 years 85cc 2 stroke and up to 150cc 4 stroke
- **J1** 9-11 years 85cc 2 stroke and 150cc 4 stroke (Standard small wheels only)
- **JJ** 7-11 years 65cc 2 stroke
- **JG2** 12-15 years 85-200 cc 2stroke and 150-250cc 4 stroke (Girls)
- **JG1** 7-11 years Up to 85 cc 2stroke and up to 150cc 4 stroke (Girls)

The age for eligibility is that of the competitor on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2019.

### 4. MINIMUM NUMBERS REQUIRED TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

#### 4.1 At a Championship Round

The minimum number of starters required to constitute a Championship Class will be five (5). If there are insufficient starters (less than five) then the Class concerned may be combined with other Classes, as determined by the Clerk of Course.

Should there be insufficient starters in any Class and a decision is made to combine or cancel Classes, then the Enduro Panel may decide to re-distribute any Championship points or awards, subject to MWA Board approval.

#### 4.2 Series

There must be at least five starters in a Class in at least 50% of the Rounds for a Championship to be declared in that Class. If less than 50% of the Rounds are bona fide Rounds, then the Enduro Panel may decide to re-distribute any Championship points or awards, subject to MWA Board approval.

### 5. EVENT CONDITIONS

#### 5.1 Point Score System

Points will be allocated as per the 2019 MoMS for Enduro.

Multi-day competition will be scored as separate Rounds for each day of competition for Championship scoring purposes.

Final results for State Championship awards will be calculated using points scored at all Rounds which comply with these regulations.

#### 5.2 Tie

In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by applying rule 12.13.9.4 of the MoMS.

#### 5.3 Protests

Any protest involving the results of the Championship is to be lodged with MWA in accordance with the 2019 MoMS.

### 6. OFFICIALS

The Steward for each Round will be appointed by MWA.

Other Officials for each Round will be appointed with the approval of MWA.

All officials must be endorsed for the Enduro discipline at the appropriate level for Open Competition, as required in the 2019 MoMS.

The nominated Officials required for each Round will be detailed in the Supplementary Regulations for each Round.

## **7. MACHINES**

Competitors are only permitted to present one (1) machine for scrutineering at each Round, and change of machine is not permitted during a Round.

As per GCR 12.19.7.2 (f) of the 2019 MoMS, all machines must remain standard to the OEM specifications.

## **8. AWARDS**

### **8.1 Championship Awards**

If at the completion of all Rounds there are less than five (5) qualifying finishers, then Championship awards will be presented by MWA on the basis of the following criteria:

- If up to three riders qualify in a Class then only FIRST place will be awarded; or
- If four riders qualify in a Class then FIRST and SECOND place will be awarded; or
- If five or more riders qualify in a Class then awards will be made for FIRST, SECOND and THIRD place.

The competitor in each Class (as described in item 3.0) accumulating the largest number of points at the conclusion of all complying Rounds will be declared the winner of the Championship for that Class.

Individual competitors will not be eligible for awards unless a bona fide attempt is made to start in at least 50% of the Rounds. Result sheets are to indicate ALL riders who start, so as to enable eligibility to be established for riders who do not finish any Rounds.

### **8.2 Championship Awards Presentation Function**

The awards will be presented at an end-of-season MWA Championship awards function, details to be announced, and all place getters are expected to attend.

The organising club or promoter of each Round shall pay a fee determined by MWA for the provision of Championship awards, and MWA will invoice the club or promoter for their share of the awards fee at the end of each Round.
